The Course will also cover a Personal and Spiritual Development Programme which will include the following Modules titles:

- Interpersonal Communication Techniques
- Observation and Assertiveness Techniques
- * Positive Self-Image
- Relationships and Coping Mechanisms
- * Peer Trust and Support
- * Personal Space
- * Me, myself and God

Duration of Course: Once a week for 10 weeks and one residential weekend. *Start Date*: February 2019 *Costs*: €100 sponsored by Parish/School *Location*: Pastoral Centre, St Peter's College, Wexford.

What is Spirit?

'Spirit' is a dynamic, exciting and motivational youth group aimed at Transition Year Students. The framework of the group is devised to encourage team work, positive peer support, friendship and a supportive value ethos.

This will be achieved through the following:

- * Weekly meetings
- * Community workgroups
- * Inspirational guest speakers
- * Trips and outings
- * Personal & Spiritual Development Programme
- * Radio programming
- Working with the Opera and local theatre
- * and much, much more.

How does youth group work?

- The Spirit youth group leaders will invite applications from Transition Year students through schools.
- Each leader and youth member is assigned a workgroup of interest to them.
- Ouring the year the member will give an hour a week to a workgroup as well as meeting once a week as a full group to allow for updates on the workgroups, as well as planning for other events.
- The group will run from October to June outside of school hours.

Spirit Activities

Weekly Meetings

All leaders and members will meet once a week to discuss their workgroups, future guest speakers, support of social issues whilst also enabling them to get to know each other.

Community Workgroups

The basis of the community workgroup is to provide a supportive service to existing groups. The workgroup must mutually benefit the recipient as well as the Spirit Member. Examples are Nursing Home, Special Olympics, etc.

Personal & Spiritual Development Course

10 week course covering interpersonal communication techniques, self-image, relationships, peer support and creativity. This course has a proven track record in strengthening friendships, building positive self-image and self-awareness, trust and self-confidence. The course has a spiritual based foundation which provides a deeper and more meaningful relationship within the journey of life.

Radio Programming

Members will get a chance to prepare and present programmes which will be aired on South East Radio.

Trips & Outings

There will be outings to places of inspiration both locally and outside of the Diocese e.g. beaches, local walks, etc.

Guest Speakers Inspirational speakers will be invited to tell their stories.

Spirit Leaders

- Spirit Leaders will be made up of clergy, religious and lay people.
- Leaders will be Garda vetted and fulfil all safeguarding requirements.
- Each workgroup will be supervised by leaders who will support and account for its members.
- Leaders will be fully trained and adhere to a stringent code of conduct.
- The role of leaders will be to support and enable Spirit members to fully benefit from their participation in the group.
- Two Leaders will be given the role as Designated Persons whose role will be to hear any concerns/issues from its members.
- The number of leaders will be in line with the supervisory requirements of the Dioce-san Safeguarding Policy.

Presentation of Certificates

At the end of their year with Spirit, all members will receive a Certificate of Membership during a formal Presentation Ceremony which will be attended by local dignitaries, representative from the workgroups, parents, and key note speakers.

Future employers value a CV that includes participation in initiatives such as Spirit as it indicates to the employer qualities such as teamwork, value system, participation in the community and personal initiative, to name but a few.
