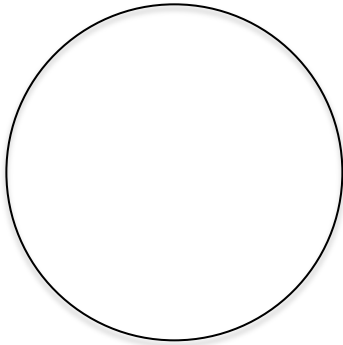

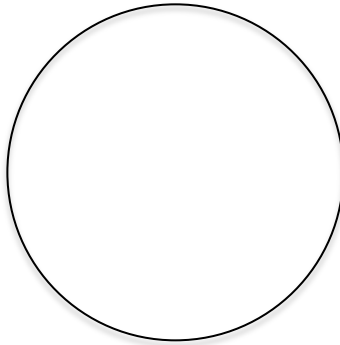

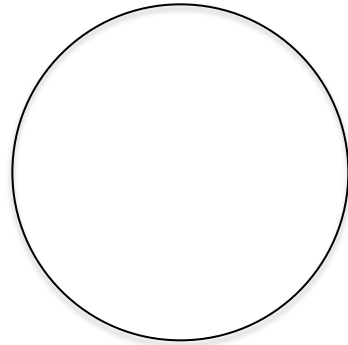
Directions: When the other disciple (John) saw the empty tomb, he believed. In the box below draw pictures of the things or the people that help you believe in God.
