FIRST READING:

The First Reading is usually taken from the Old Testament. This, the first and older section of the Bible, was originally written in Hebrew or <u>Aramaic</u>, and is accepted as being religiously inspired and sacred by both <u>Jews</u> and <u>Christians</u>. It begins with the creation, but the main theme of the Old Testament is the history of the <u>Hebrews</u>.

In addition, there are many examples of prophetic writing, poetry, [e.g. Psalms and Proverbs] and short narrative tales. Sometimes the first reading is from The Acts of the Apostles which gives an account of the early work of Jesus' friends as they spread "the Good News"

Reader starts by saying "The First reading is from...."

Reader concludes with; The Word of the Lord

Congregational Response: Thanks be to God

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: The congregation is invited to "Stand to greet the Gospel" A Gospel Acclamation, which prepares us to hear the "Good News" is a phrase from Scripture which is relevant to the readings being proclaimed or to the particular occasion. The phrase is proceeded and followed by "Alleluia" except during the Season of Lent.

<u>RESPONSORIAL PSALM:</u> "Psalms" is a book of poetry with 150 chapters. The Hebrew title of this book means "songs of praise," while the Greek title, *Psalmoi*, has come to mean "sacred songs sung to musical accompaniment." The words of many hymns and contemporary worship songs are taken directly from the Psalms. For example "The Lord is my Shepherd" /" On Eagles Wings", the sung chants in Taize and even some popular songs such as "By the Rivers of Babylon" [Boney M]

Although David is credited with writing seventy-three of the poems, other contributors include Moses, Solomon, Asaph, and the Sons of Korah. The entire collection is thought to have been compiled over a period of a thousand years. In the context of our Catholic ceremonies the first main section is The Liturgy of The Word and within this the Responsorial Psalm is between the First and Second reading and can be read or sung. As the term "Responsorial Psalm" suggests a key message within the psalm is used as a response after each verse.

SECOND READING:

The Second Reading of the mass is taken from the New Testament as are the Gospel readings. In the second reading we are listening to letters from Jesus' disciples to His followers and to the people in the towns in which they spoke about His life and His works. The term "Epistle" is the ancient Greek word for "letter" and can be a poem or other literary work in the form of a letter or series of letters. Many of these in the New Testament were credited to St. Paul but some were also written by James, Timothy and Peter.

The Epistles or "Letters from__" were a common form of instruction and have their parallel in Islamic literature [rasáil]

Within each reading is a "Lesson" which exhorts the listeners to live as Jesus taught them.

If only one reading is being read at mass before The Gospel, it is taken from The New Testament followed by a Responsorial Psalm.

Many of the readings inserted within each Celebration can be effectively used for more than one of the occasions. I have inserted some a number of times where they may be relevant. The readings etc. are merely suggestions and allow for flexibility of choice.

Reader starts by saying "The First reading is from...."

Reader concludes with; The Word of the Lord

Congregational Response: Thanks be to God

A child may also invite the congregation to stand to greet the Gospel.

[Please note: "Alleluia" is not used during the Season of Lent, either in prayer or within the words of a hymn.] A <u>gospel acclamation</u> is a short, <u>simple</u> statement <u>of faith</u>, often sung or chanted. It is usually based on a biblical passage

The Gospels tell the story of Jesus' life on earth and each is written from a different perspective. **Matthew** focuses on Jesus as a teacher and as the "new Messiah" and greater than all the prophets who had gone before Him. **Mark** also speaks about Jesus the Messiah and his narrative concentrates on how all of Jesus' life on earth led to His death and resurrection. **Luke** takes a very historical perspective and relays the origins, birth, ministry, death, resurrection and asceension. **John** tells us the story of the life of Jeus from a very human aspect, focusing on what it means to be a believer of Jesus as He lived "in the flesh". In this Gospel the miracles Jesus performed are told in detail. **The Acts of the Anostles** is relaying to us an account of the early works of those spreading the news

The Acts of the Apostles isrelaying to us an account of the early works of those spreading the news of the Gospels and establishing the church

The Epistles were letters written to the people visited by various disciples in their endeavours to spread the Good News, reminding them of all the important things they had been told.

PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL / PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION:

In the "Prayers of the Faithful/Intercession" we are invited to pray for the concerns of the Church and the world. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, no. 69 says, "In the Universal prayer or Prayer of the Faithful, the people respond in some sense to the Word of God which they have received in faith and offer prayers to God for the salvation of all." In other words, the intention behind the inclusion of the prayers of intercession is to allow the congregation to ask God for His Help. These prayers are always addressed to God, Our Father. Prayers of thanks may be offered at some other point in the ceremony, for example after Communion or before the Concluding prayer.

The <u>recommended</u> order of the Prayers is;

- 1. For the needs of the Church
- 2. For the world
- 3. For those in need
- 4. For the local community
- 5. For the Dead

These prayers are designed to be freely composed, church by church. In some cases the children may like to write them themselves. It is permitted to include more than one prayer under each recommended heading. The Prayers of Intercession are offered immediately after the congregation join the celebrant in reciting The Creed.

"The Prayers of the Faithful" are preceded by an invitation from the celebrant to the congregation to offer their intercessions and prayers of petition. Following the final Prayer of Intercession the celebrant will say a Concluding prayer.

St. Paul advises us "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" Philippians 4:6

The Readers finish each Prayer of Intercession / Prayer of the Faithful with one of the following or with a similar responses

Reader "Lord Hear us"

Congregation "Lord graciously hear us".

Reader "A Thiarna éist linn"

Congregation: "A Thiarna bí cheannsa agus éist linn"

Reader "Lord in Your Mercy"

Congregation "Hear out prayer"

Reader: "We pray to the Lord"

Congregation: "Lord hear our prayer"

Depending on the circumstances, 4 - 6 prayers will be sufficient. These can be read by 1 child or a number of children. Most of them can be used throughout the year/repeated at various other liturgical gatherings.

Consider asking the children to compose these.

Start of a New Academic Year

LENT

Lent is typically observed in preparation for commemorating Jesus' death and resurrection at Easter. From Ash Wednesday until Easter Sunday, it has been customary to fast or abstain from something. Much like how we prepare for other significant events in our personal lives, such as weddings or birthdays, Lent calls for us to ready our minds and hearts to remember the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. NOTE: As the word "Alleluia" is one of celebration it is not used during the season of Lent either as part of a prayer or in song.

<u>READINGS</u>: If proclaiming two readings chose one from the Old Testament and one from the New Testament. If only one reading is being used it is usually chosen it from the New Testament. The Psalm is read between the 1st and 2nd reading or after the 1st Reading

At the end of each Reading Reader: The Word of the Lord

All: Thanks be to God.

Isaiah 58 I have chosen a fasting where I will try to help those suffering injustice and help those in need.

Joel 2: "Even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart with fasting and sadness for any wrong you may have done. Return to the Lord your God, for he is kind, slow to anger and generous in love.

Isaiah 30:18 Yet the Lord wants to be kind to you; He will rise up to show you compassion. For the Lord is a God of justice. Blessed are all who wait for him!

Lamentations 3:25 The Lord is good to those whose hope is in him, to the ones who seeks him;

FIRST RECONCILIATION and FIRST EUCHARIST

First Reconciliation (Confession/Penance):

The Sacrament of First Reconciliation/ First Penance often gets lost or considered unimportant in the light of the great preparations for First Eucharist / First Communion. It is however one of the 7 Sacraments and is a very important step in the moral and religious development of a child. It marks the beginning of the age of reason whereby the child must start to recognise that all actions have consequences. More importantly however, it is an opportunity to teach our children that when they take responsibility for their deeds and express remorse, they will always be forgiven by God. It is a time also when we can help the child to know without doubt that even though God [or indeed we] might not like something they do they will always be loved for themselves. Consider dramatising in mime or with a simple script some relevant stories from Scripture for this ceremony e.g. Zacchaus or The Prodigal Son.

Readings:

Daniel 9:9 "The Lord our God is merciful and forgiving, even though we might have turned away from Him."

Isaiah 43:25 "I, am he who blots out any wrong you do and remembers your sins no more ..."

Isaiah 1: 18 "Come now, let us settle the matter, "says the Lord. 'Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow

Ephesians 4:32. "Be kind to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

Matthew 6: And please forgive us any wrong we do just as we forgive those who do wrong to us

John 1:9 "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and kind and will forgive us our sins."

- 2 Corinthians 4: All this is for your benefit, so that the grace that is reaching more and more people may cause thanksgiving to overflow to the glory of God.
- 2 Corinthians 9: Thanks be to God for his indescribable gifts!
- 1 James 1: You can think of troubles with some joy, because you know that when your faith is tested you can develop perseverance. Perseverance will strengthen your personality and you will grow to be mature and complete, not lacking anything.

Philippeans 4: Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, in prayer and asking, , present your requests to God with gratitude in your hearts. The peace of God, which is too amazing for our understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

- 1 Thessalonians 5: Rejoice always, Pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.
- 1 Corinthians 10: So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God.

James 1:17 Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from our Father in heaven, who does not change like moving shadows do.

Colossians 2: So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him.
